

English

This term, we will be using video clips to support our writing. 'RUIN' is a post-apocalyptic clip which will allow for great narrative opportunities and tension building. Our second clip 'The Present', will demonstrate different levels of formality as well as writing from different viewpoints. The Year 6 children will be applying their learning from across their time in school to write in a variety of genres, which will showcase their imagination, vocabulary and drafting skills. Our Year 5s will consolidate their understanding of higher order punctuation and organisation of ideas into paragraphs. There will also be a focus on editing and the importance of editing thoroughly for all of our pupils.

Maths

Our focus in maths this term includes completing the geometry unit of position and direction, using identifying co-ordinates and translating shapes to new positions accurately. We will be learning about ratio and proportion, using the correct written form, and solving problems using sequences and simplifying examples. During our unit on statistics we will be drawing and interpreting line graphs and pie charts, using percentages to answer a set of questions about given pie charts. We will use the data to identify the mean. We would also like to remind all members of year 5 and 6 to continue to practice their multiplication tables on Times Tables Rock Stars.

Geography. This term, we will be studying Europe and the North and South American countries. We will use a range of sources, including atlases and the internet to research the regions. We will also be looking at the local area and reviewing the range of land use, then we will complete fieldwork along the Chipping Sodbury high street and the River Frome that flows through the area.

In **PE** this term, children will be working on their athletic skills. This will include general fitness as well as focussing on sprint technique, relay racing, and throwing and jumping techniques.

PSHE. This term pupils will be comparing different types of friendships and the feelings associated with them. They will also explain how to stay safe when using technology and communicating with friends, including how to stand up for themselves, negotiate and resist peer pressure.

Science. Following on from last term's focus on the circulatory system and the heart this term pupils will be learning about how to keep their bodies healthy and what can damage our bodies. We will look at what constitutes a healthy diet and different food groups. In addition, we will learn about how nutrients are transported around the body and research pioneering scientists that contributed towards our understanding of the blood and heart.

Computing. The focus this term will be around privacy and security and how a flat-file database can be used to organise data in records. Pupils use tools within a database to order and answer questions about data. They create graphs and charts from their data to help solve problems. They use a real-life database to answer a question, and present their work to others.

RE. For the next two terms our focus will be understanding what it is like to be a Muslim in Britain today. Pupils explore the five pillars of Islam and the importance of these to Muslim believers. UKS2 Homework Expectations

Children are expected to spend approximately 30 minutes each night on homework. This is a recommended outline:

Monday	Reading and spelling practice (including Spelling Shed).
Tuesday	Number clubs and times table practice (including TTRS).
Wednesday	Reading, spelling practice (including Spelling Shed).
Thursday	30 minutes working on Maths or English.
Friday	30 minutes working on Maths or English.

Much of the English homework is topic related but you are more than welcome to extend your learning further through additional research and being creative. Please refer to the separate spelling and topic project letters for more detail on specific tasks. These can be found on the Class Story section on Dojo.

Reading Awards

Thank you to everyone for reading regularly at home. Practise not only helps reading itself, but it allows children to enhance their vocabulary and understanding of different text types. To help your child to achieve their awards, please sign their record after each read. Well done for all our award winners so far this year!

Ways to help at home:

1. Help children to complete their homework and take pride in what they produce. It is vital that children complete their homework on time as it gives the opportunity to consolidate what they have learnt in class.
 2. Read with them as often as possible or ask them questions about what they have been reading if they are more confident.
 3. Encourage them to pack their own school bag, taking responsibility for their own things.
 4. Ask your child open questions about what they have done at school and discuss it, eg 'what was the highlight of your day?'; 'what did you learn today?'; or 'what did you enjoy most in class today?'
 5. Correct their speech if they say things incorrectly.
 6. Orally practice times tables or related facts e.g. $6 \times 7 = 42$, $0.6 \times 7 = 4.2$.
- NOTE: By the end of Y4 children should know all of their times tables up to 12x12.**
7. Ask them to tell you what the time is using analogue clocks.
 8. Challenge them to add up shopping items or select which option is best value for money.
 9. Play educational games on the Internet.
 10. Help them become independent learners by having set routines eg always do homework and go to bed at a set time.
