



Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to school, I hope you had an enjoyable Easter break. It is hard to believe that there are only 2 terms left.

Our topic this term is 'Smashing Saxons'. We will be exploring what archaeologists have uncovered about the Anglo-Saxons and their relationships to the other groups in and around Britain at that time, in particular the Vikings. We will be learning about the Anglo Saxons, how England was established and what we know about the people's culture, religion and way of life. After half term, we will uncover more about the Vikings, their invasion, relationship with the Anglo-Saxons and life in Britain during their influence. Please feel free to share this topic with your child at home. The children are welcome to bring in any additional information/artefacts/pictures to share with the class.

In English, we will be writing to entertain inspired by the book 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' which is one of the Brownstone series of historical mythology inspired stories. We shall also be covering instruction writing and formal and informal letter writing. This term we will be recapping skills from throughout the year, including speech, verb tenses, adverbials and apostrophes.

Maths will include units on decimals, measure, time and shape. At home, you can support your child by ensuring they can tell the time using an analogue clock (ie a clock with hands, not just digital). Please continue to encourage your child to practice their times table facts, especially those in Year 3 who are still working towards their 50 Club. Children are expected to know their multiplication tables by the end of Y4.

The Science unit this term will be investigating light, shadow and electricity. Our D&T unit will be examining the strength of structures and how to cut and join wood. We will also be designing and creating Anglo-Saxon inspired wooden shelters. In RE we will be studying why Jesus is important to some people and considering why life is seen as a journey. In PSHE we are studying the units *Relationships* and *Changes*.

PE will continue to be on Monday (swimming) and Wednesday. Please ensure that your child comes to school in their PE kit and that earrings are removed and long hair is tied back. Our remaining swimming sessions are 22/04, 29/04, 20/05, 10/06 and 17/06. The reading book swap is on Monday and our library day is Thursday. Please remind your child to bring in their library book on Thursdays and reading book every Monday so that the books can be changed and read in class.

A huge well done to all the children who embraced the homework challenges set last term. We were also really impressed with all the 'top trump' contributions which will make a great set for the children to play with this term. This term's homework will continue to include reading, practising spelling patterns, number clubs and topic (described on the other side of this letter).

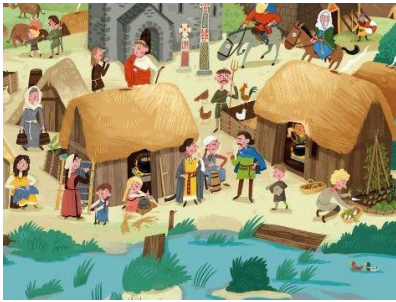
