Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to school! We hope you had an enjoyable Christmas break. Thank you for your thoughtful Christmas gifts; they were very much appreciated.

As you are probably aware, our topic this term is 'Ancient Brits'. We will be covering the following themes:

- The use of wood, stone and animal skin during the Stone Age; particularly to make tools and weapons
- The development towards using metals during the Bronze and Iron Age
- The Invasion of Britain leading to Britain becoming part of the Roman Empire
- An evaluation of the reasons the Romans came to Britain
- Resistance of the Roman invasion, including a study of Boudicca
- How the developments during the Roman occupation, such as roads, have impacted life today
- What life was like in Roman Britain and what it would have been like to be a Roman soldier.

Below are some suggested activities that children can do at home to support the class work on our topic. Please send any work to school on the week of the due date when there will be an opportunity to share their work with the rest of the class and display work showing good effort.

This term's English and Maths homework will continue to include regular reading, practising spelling patterns, TTRS and practise of number clubs.

In English, we will be writing adventure stories inspired by 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura and using our knowledge of the Stone Age to create survival guides. Later in the term, we will be exploring 'Wolves in the Walls' by Neil Gaiman and writing letters in role as Romans. We will be focusing on punctuating speech

correctly, using conjunctions to join sentences and using a range of fronted adverbials at the start of our sentences.

In Maths this term, we will continue our work on written calculation methods, moving on to division methods. We will also be studying measure including perimeter and area. Towards the end of the spring term, we will be studying fractions and decimals. Throughout this term, we will be focusing on children learning their multiplication tables. The aim is for all Y4 children to know all their tables and division facts up to 12 x12. For most children, their number club reflects where they are on this journey. Times Table Rock Stars are also set to the level your child is working at. Please continue to support your child with learning their times tables at home. Children will be tested every Monday.

In RE, we will be examining different people's views on God and finding out how family life and festivals matter to the Jewish people. Our PSHE units will be 'Going for Goals' and 'Healthy me'. During Art, we will be developing our drawing skills and exploring printing techniques. All the children in LKS2 will be having weekly drumming lessons during terms 3&4, and we will be inviting you in to school to their drumming performance at the end of these sessions.

Liberty will return to PE sessions every Monday and Wednesday. Please ensure that your child wears their PE kit on these days, with earrings removed and hair tied up. Our book change is Wednesday and our library day is Friday. Please remind your child to bring in their library and reading book, including their reading record on that day so that books can be changed.
